





## APPENDIX E

### RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENT PARKING STICKER

1. Motor vehicle must be registered in the Commonwealth and have a gross weight of less than 2 ½ tons.
2. Vehicle must be principally garaged in the City of Framingham, at an eligible address (see list of eligible streets on Schedule 2).
3. Vehicle must be owned or used by a resident of the City of Framingham.
4. Applicants must show proof of residency (current vehicle registration).
5. Resident Parking stickers must be permanently affixed to the lower corner of the driver's side windshield.
6. The annual fee for Resident Parking stickers will be **\$25.00 per vehicle**. Each replacement sticker shall also cost \$25.00. Payment is only accepted by check or money order – no cash or credit cards. See application for instructions on how to submit payment.
7. Parking Restrictions apply as shown on application.
8. **All stickers and placards will be void during any announced parking ban during weather emergencies. Resident sticker parking does not supersede other parking restrictions such as prohibitions for street sweeping.**
9. All parking fines for the vehicle must be paid before issuance.
10. All stickers and placards will expire on December 31, of each year. New stickers and placards for the new calendar year will become available for purchase by November 1 of the preceding year.

## APPENDIX E

### RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENT PARKING STICKER

1. Motor vehicle must be registered in the Commonwealth and have a gross weight of less than ~~2 ½~~ 3 ½ tons.
2. Vehicle must be principally garaged in the City of Framingham, at an eligible address (see list of eligible streets on Schedule 2).
3. Vehicle must be owned or used by a resident of the City of Framingham.
4. Applicants must show proof of residency (current vehicle registration).
5. Resident Parking stickers must be permanently affixed to or temporary placards must be placed at the lower corner of the driver's side ~~rear~~ windshield.
6. The annual fee for Resident Parking stickers ~~will be~~ may not exceed \$25.00 per vehicle. Each replacement sticker shall also ~~cost~~ not exceed \$25.00. Payment is only accepted by check or money order – no cash or credit cards. See application for instructions on how to submit payment.
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8. **All stickers and placards will be void during any announced parking ban during weather emergencies. Resident sticker parking does not supersede other parking restrictions such as prohibitions for street sweeping.**
9. All parking fines for the vehicle must be paid before issuance.
10. All stickers and placards will expire on December 31, of each year. New stickers and placards for the new calendar year will become available for purchase by November 1 of the preceding year.
11. Temporary Parking Permits: For new residents moving to Framingham and in the process of re-registering a vehicle, or if you are a current permit holder and are using substitute transportation, you may qualify for a temporary parking permit.
  - a. Temporary passes will be valid for 45 days.
  - b. For new residents: You must bring a lease or proof of residency along with your vehicle registration. Qualified applicants will be required to pay the yearly application fee. Proof of Framingham residency must be provided to obtain an annual sticker at the end of the 45 day period.
  - c. Should a current holder of a Resident Parking Sticker need to utilize a temporary substitute vehicle in place of a currently stickered vehicle, the holder may be issued a temporary permit by the Treasurer's Office. A copy of the registration of the substitute vehicle must be provided.

**5. Briefly describe the nature of the problem and your request.**

The intersection of Pleasant Street and Maynard Road presents persistent safety issues stemming from poor sightlines and fast-moving traffic that has resulted in property damage to residents. The angled entry from Maynard compounds the challenge resulting in numerous motor vehicle accidents. The lack of crosswalks across Pleasant Street also make it difficult for residents on the south side of Pleasant Street to reach the sidewalks on the northside of the street. We propose a raised crosswalk as a safe, visually appropriate intervention for the historic district but defer to the committee for the best course of action to make this intersection safe.
